Anthropic launched **Claude for Teachers**. Verified U.S. K–12 educators get premium Claude at no cost. Here's how to start, in three steps.

1

Go to claude.com/solutions/teachers

The official Claude for Teachers page. Type it in or scan the code below. **Best to sign up on a computer.**

2

Click "Get verified"

Tap "Get verified," sign in with your school Google account or email, and confirm you're a U.S. K–12 educator. **You'll show quick proof you teach: teacher badge, paystub, etc.**

3

Start using it, free

Open Claude and type a request in plain English. Try one of the five prompts on the back of this page.

THE ONE GOLDEN RULE

Never type a student's name or identifying details into any AI tool. Say "a 4th grader reading two years below level," never "Emma reads at a 2nd-grade level." (And check your district's policy.)



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Ask us about Claude Education Courses

5 prompts to try Monday.

Copy these into Claude and fill in the yellow parts. One for every kind of teacher.

Level any text DIFFERENTIATION

"Rewrite the passage below at five reading levels (2nd–6th grade), keeping the same key ideas and vocabulary so every group works the same lesson. [paste passage]"

Full comprehension set ANY GRADE

"From the passage below, write 12 questions for [grade]: 4 literal, 4 inferential, 4 evaluative, with an answer key. [paste passage]"

Rubric with exemplars WRITING

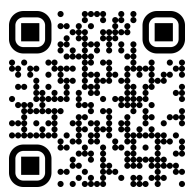
"Build a 4-point rubric for a [grade] [assignment] aligned to [state] standards, student-friendly, with one example paragraph at each level."

Feedback that teaches SECONDARY ELA

"Here's anonymous [grade] student writing. Give two specific strengths (name the technique), one priority to grow, and one revision to try today, warm and student-friendly. [paste, no names]"

The hard parent email COMMUNICATION

"Draft a warm, professional email to a parent about [situation, described generally]. Specific, kind, under 200 words, no jargon. No student names. I'll add them."
